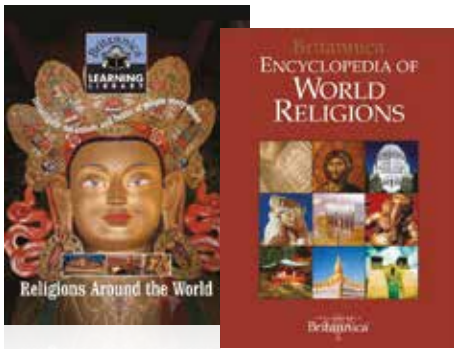

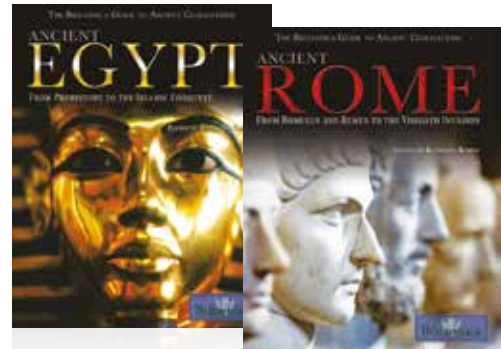

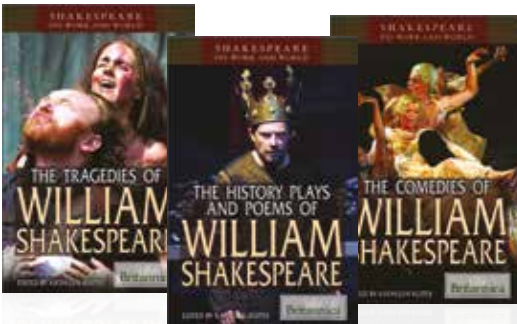

Shakespeare: His work and world

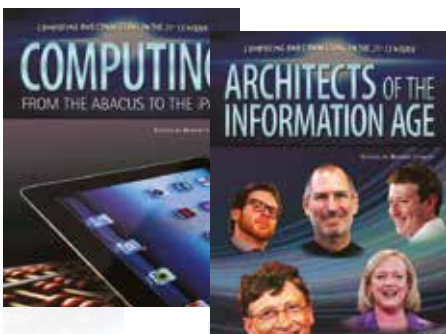

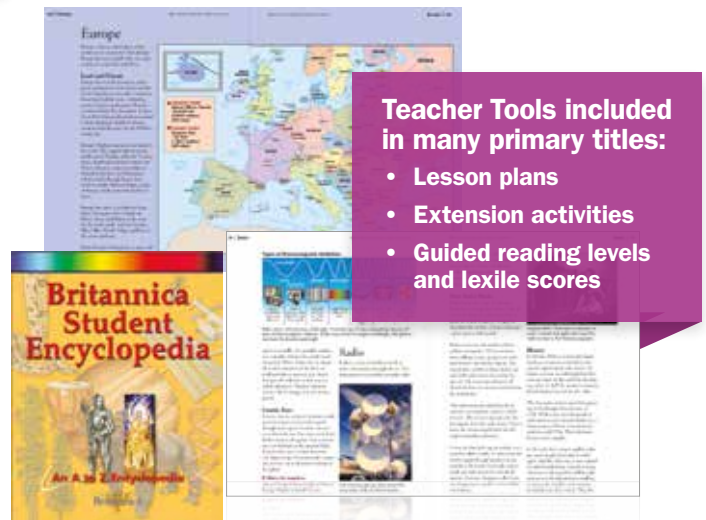
