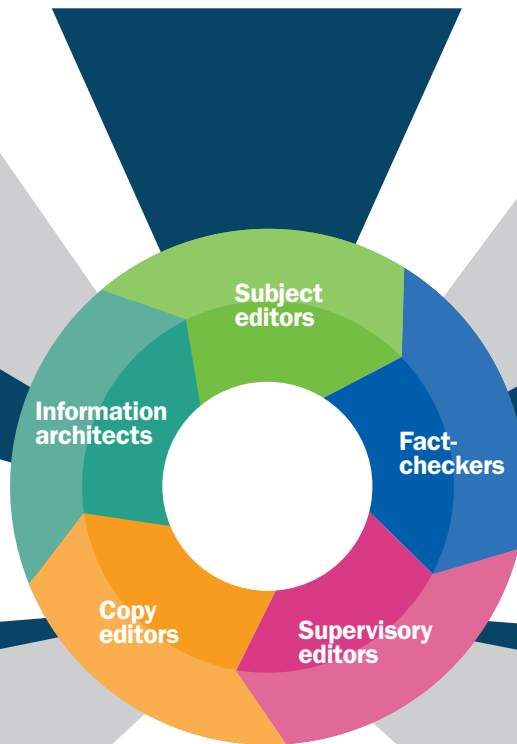
Information architects
