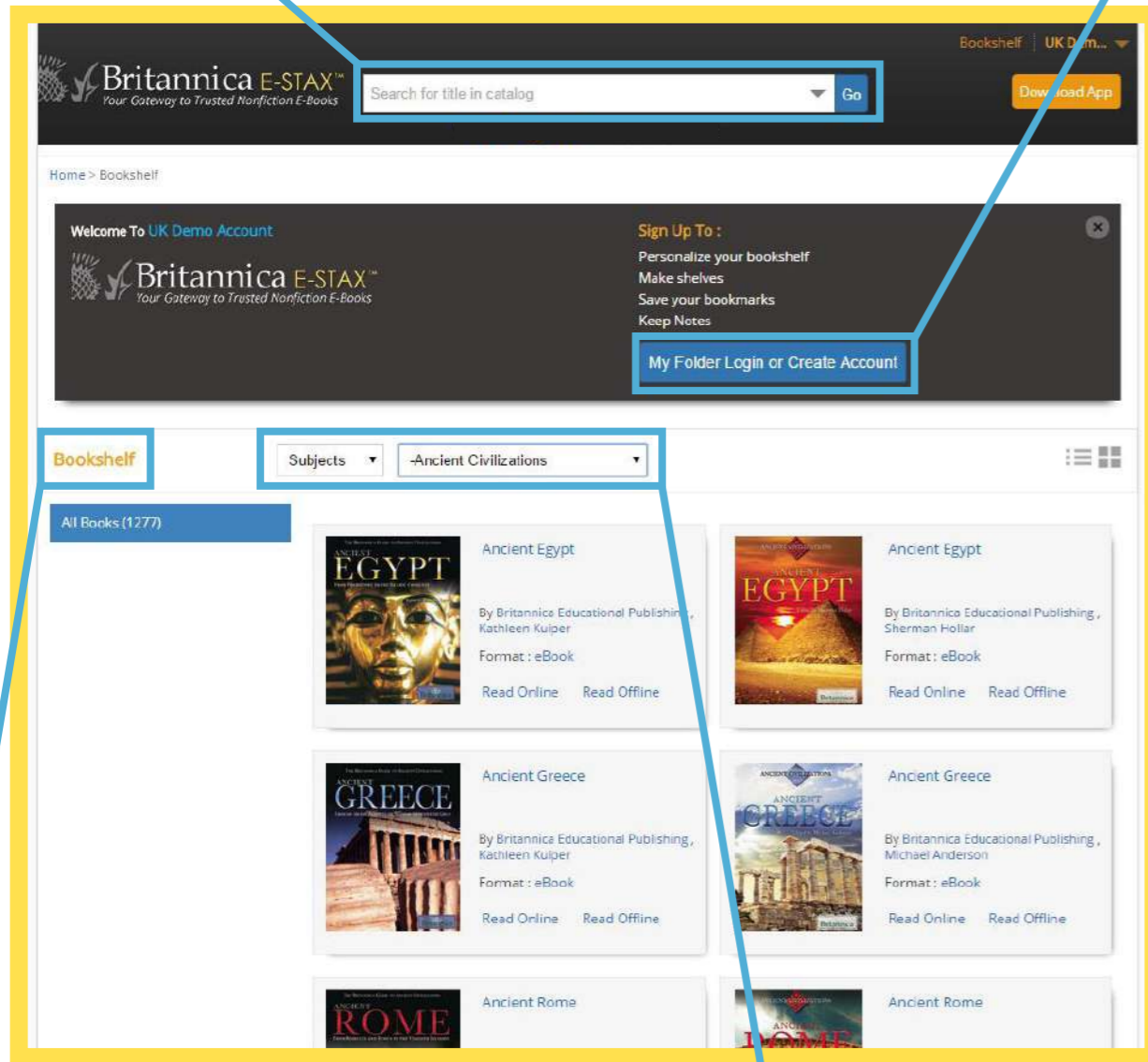

Search by keyword or title!

Here you can create a personal login, where you can store notes, bookmarks and highlighted materials in any e-books.



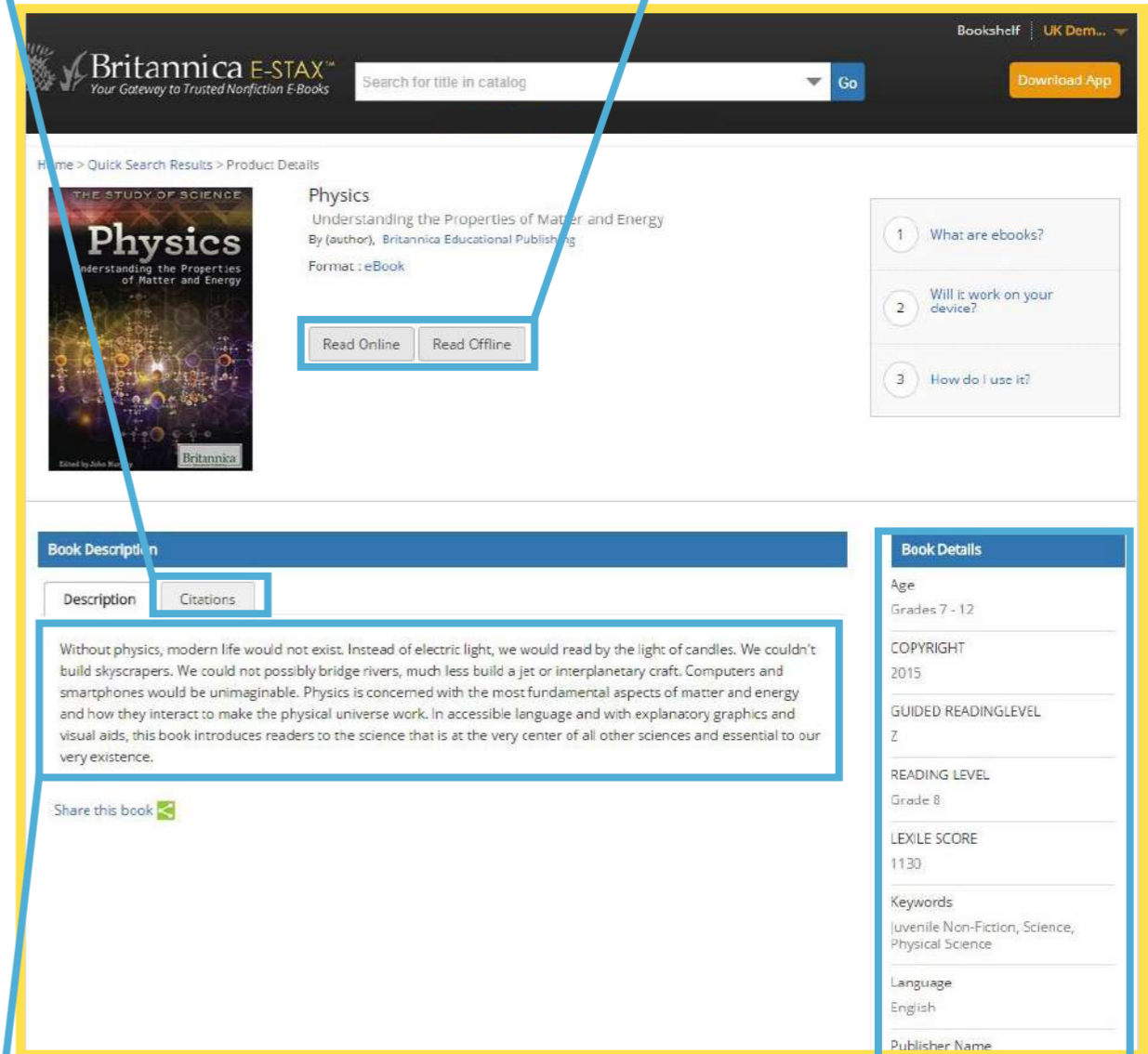
The **Bookshelf** contains all the books you have access to.

Browse by series, collection or subject.

Book details

The **Citation** tab provides pre-populated citations for easy use in reports.

The **Read Online** button opens the title in E-Stax and the **Read Offline** button downloads the title as a PDF.



The **Description** tab provides an overview of the title's contents.

Here you will find recommended reading level, number of pages and additional information.

In the book

Use the search box to keyword search within the text of the e-book.

The tools here allow you to switch between single and double-page views, zoom in and out, view in fullscreen, rotate pages and find citations.

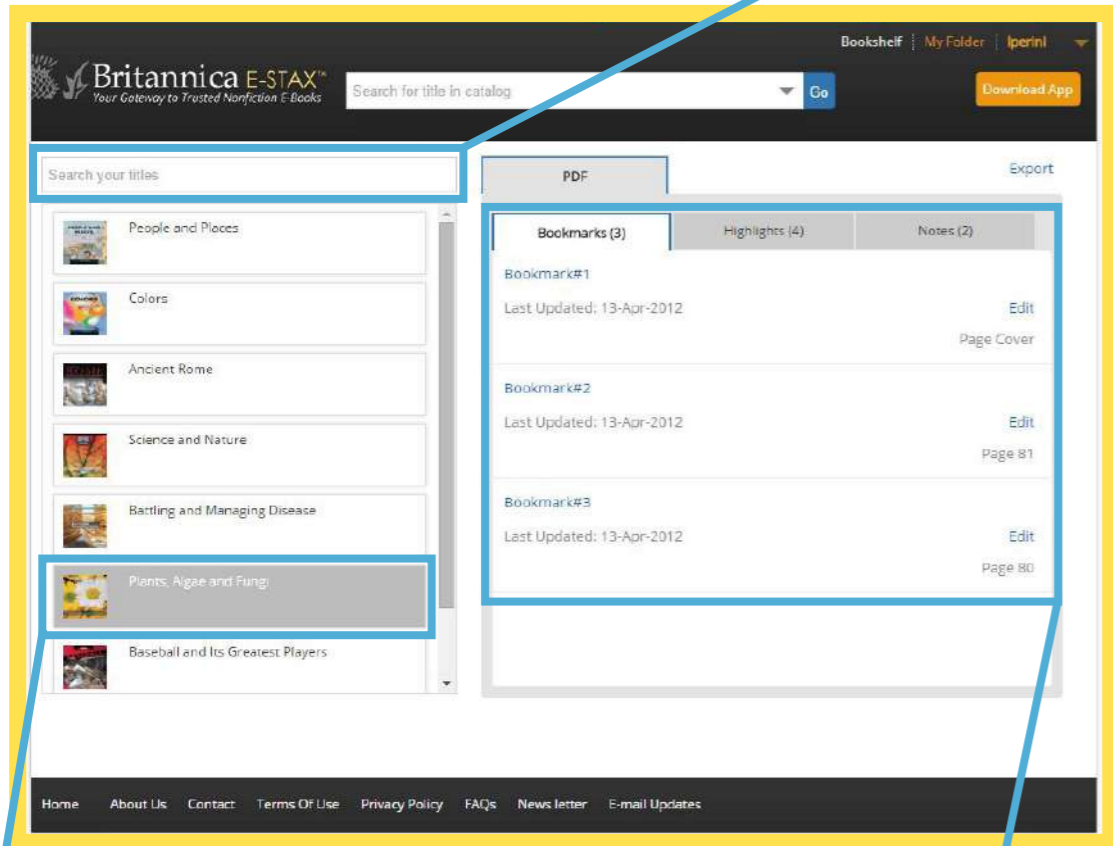
The Table of Contents hyperlinks to chapters and sections within the text.

Use the Highlight tool to highlight and copy text.

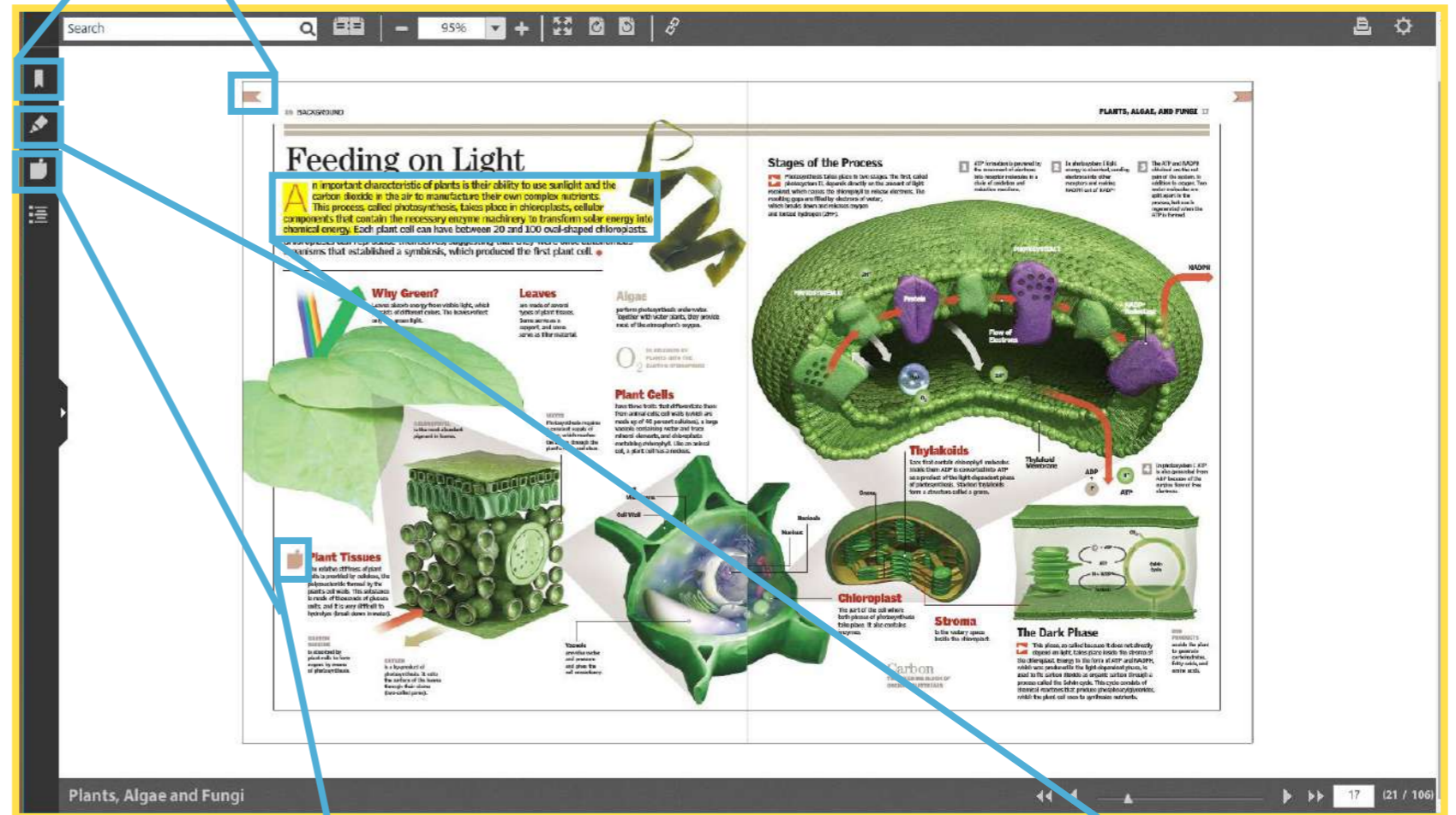
Easily navigate through pages by using forward and back arrows, slide ruler or even jump to a specific page by typing in the page number. You can also see the full number of pages here.

Highlights – highlight text so you can easily find it again later.
